Sound Environmental Education Principles

Diving deep into Key Characteristic 2 from the NAAEE Community Engagement Guidelines for Excellence, this course is designed to provide educators with the background knowledge and skills necessary to engage communities in environmental education experiences that are based on established principles and proven practices in the field.



Capacity Building & Long-Term Investment in Change

Rounding out the final Key Characteristics from the Community Engagement Guidelines for Excellence, in this course, participants explore how environmental education can support capacity building for ongoing civic engagement in communities and the long-term commitment required to do so.



Elective eeCOURSE

Choose one of the following -

CEG230: Environmental Education for All – designed to provide a strong foundation in and introduction to the language, concepts, and principles of equity work, while sparking interest in further learning around these topics.

EE210: Foundations in Teaching Environmental Education – designed to provide educators with the background knowledge and skills necessary to develop and implement learning experiences in the best practices of environmental education.

ENV240: Climate Science & Communication – designed to teach the basics of climate science and introduce educators to climate change communication strategies. Features activities from Project WET's Climate, Water and Resilience Educator Module.
